# President's Message-September 2023

Welcome Back! As President of the Central New York Association of Professional Geologists (CNYAPG), and on behalf of the CNYAPG board of directors, I would like to welcome our returning members, sponsors, newly enrolled members, and supporters to our 2023-2024 season. We all hope you and your families, and loved ones, are safe and healthy and had a great and enjoyable summer. As we had, starting last year, will be having our monthly gatherings on the 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday of each month, both in-person at Spaghetti Warehouse and virtual via Zoom. CNYAPG has again, thanks to the tireless work of our Vice President, Sean Pepling, has put together a great lineup of great guest speakers for this fall. It is hoped that they will both educate and captivate you.

To start off I just want to say thanks once again to our May guest speaker, Dr. David Finkelstein of Hobert & William Smith College. Thanks for a great talk, Dave. On September 6<sup>th</sup>, CNYAPG will be hosting Felicia Bechtel of RETTEW. Her talk is entitled "How to Find, Map, and Manage What You Want to Hit or Miss Before Digging, Drilling, or Building." This is a talk I think will be of interest to anyone performing subsurface investigations. In October, we are planning on hosting Dr. David Valentino from SUNY Oswego, who will be speaking on A Neoproterozoic Basin Beneath Ithaca, New York (Question Mark). In November, we are planning to have Dr. Bryce Hand from Syracuse University, who will be speaking on Syracuse Meltwater Channels. Lastly, to ring in the holidays, Dr. Kris Kusnerik from Hamilton College will be making a presentation that will be a surprise.

During this summer of Canadian and Hawaiian wildfires and Northeastern tornados that has reminded all of us that we are in an era of climate change, there were several smaller, less noteworthy events. On May 19<sup>th</sup> there was a 2.2 magnitude earthquake with an epicenter approximately 1.24 miles south-southwest of Hastings-on-the-Hudson, and a hypocenter of 5.5 miles below the surface. A week later, on May 25<sup>th</sup> there was a magnitude 1.4 earthquake with an epicenter less than one mile southwest of Adams Center, New York, and a hypocenter 3.1 miles below the surface. And just this month (on August 15<sup>th</sup>), there has been a magnitude 1.5 earthquake with an epicenter approximately 0.62 miles north-northeast of Depew, New York, with a hypocenter approximately 5.2 miles below the surface. Also, on August 17<sup>th</sup>, a magnitude 1.0 earthquake with an epicenter approximately half a mile Southwest of the town of Meridian, New York, and with a hypocenter of approximately 3.1 miles below the surface. Humm! Could we see a magnitude 5.0 somewhere in the state in the near future? Stay tuned. Also, I hope you all had a chance to see some of the Perseid meteor shower before it ends on September 1<sup>st</sup>.

Some other upcoming events of interest: Northeast-AIPG will be hosting a quarterly webinar on September 26<sup>th</sup>. The webinar entitled: Tectonic Significance of Structural Analysis and Metabasalt Geochemical Data of Pre-Devonian Rocks in Northern Maine will be presented by Dr. Adam Schoonmaker of Utica University.
